

New Music Out!

Boca Raton, Florida – Local composer Alon Oscar Deutsch released his first three albums.

His music has been described with such words as “surreal” and “complex”. Composing since the age of twelve, he performed as first chair guitarist with his high school’s varsity jazz band, and after over two decades of writing he has released his first three albums over a span of three months.

The first album, entitled “Original Works”, contains music written upon leaving the United States Naval Service and is just under half an hour long. It is mostly classical, inspired by such composers as Mendelssohn, Rachmaninoff, and Bach, but contains music influenced by traditional Asian, Hispanic, and African-American composers as well. The longest piece is just over ten minutes; Alon says it is because he doesn’t want to “bore the modern listener”, while leaving room for other composers to be performed in a concert.

The second album is called “Ætiology” and follows in the direction of the first album; it is just under half an hour long. The music was written this year and has klezmer and swing tracks along with classical, and even a child’s lullaby.

The third album, “Expression”, contains his earliest works, written in his teenage years, which are mostly experimental, though there are also trance and ragtime tracks. The album is a quarter of an hour long, and most of the tracks are supposed to represent a letter in a typical Myers-Briggs code.
